Through Public Health campaigns we actively contribute on a local level and through our social media campaigns. Below are a few examples of campaigns that have taken place throughout all five regional offices.

EMRO

In Jordan, an event was held titled 'An introduction to Tobacco Dependence Treatment (TDT)', this event was held alongside the King Hussein Cancer Center. The event introduced pharmacists to the different tobacco dependence treatments and provided smoking cessation treatments in Ministry of Health clinics and pharmacies.

EuRO

During the EuRO Pharmacy Week on Non-Communicable Diseases, Tobacco was highlighted as a risk factor for the development of Asthma, Cancer and COPD. There was also a collaborative World No Tobacco Day Campaign held by Austria, Germany, Romania and Switzerland. The Campaign focused on debunking myths around smoking and tobacco use.

APRO

A Model WHO event was held where the topic was 'Providing Solutions to Reduce Tobacco-Related Mortality and Morbidity in the Asia Pacific Countries' the aim was to educate future pharmacists on current tobacco-related policies and fostering aspirations of pharmacy-led tobacco cessation. An anti-tobacco campaign was held in Malaysia which had a target audience of 13-21 year olds, as that is the most common age where people are first introduced to smoking. The aim of the event was to raise awareness to youngsters on the effects and consequences of smoking and secondhand smoking, as well as informing them of different nicotine replacement therapies.

AfRO

In Sierra-Leone, a campaign was carried out in 10 schools, in collaboration with the WHO and ministry of health. Members visited the schools and raised awareness about tobacco, educating youngsters on the health implications of smoking and also regarding the substances present in tobacco which may be harmful if misused. The campaign also focused on the importance of having an environment free of tobacco.

PARO

In Columbia, during World No Tobacco Day, a campaign was held in different sections of the country; a conference was held on the consequences of tobacco use and an activity was held where a cigarette was exchange for a healthy snack
