* The role of nurses in tobacco control is well evidenced and ICN works to support nurses to perform at their highest potential. As a participant of the WHO NCD/GCM, ICN works to build the capacity & capability of the nursing profession to support global efforts to prevent, control & manage NCDs in all settings & at all service levels. ICN continues to contribute to the implementation of the WHO Global NCD Action Plan 2013-2020 and lobby governments to ensure effective implementation of the plan including the tobacco related nursing interventions to reduce NCD risk factors as recommended actions. ICN was actively involved in providing recommendations to support the WHO High-level Commission on NCDs, established in advance of the 73rd UNGA to identify ways to reduce mortality & improve life expectancy from NCDs. ICN President was appointed as a Commissioner.

ICN is also on the Steering Committee for the Global Coalition for Circulatory Health. This coalition brings together international, regional and national stakeholders in circulatory health to drive the urgent action needed to combat heart disease and stroke. A key priority for this group is develop strategies and actions to reduce smoking prevalence and uptake.

One of the main sessions focused on Tobacco Control, Health Promotion and Prevention Strategies. Prof. Sophia Chan, Secretary for Food and Health, Hong Kong, presented to the audience the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government's policy to discourage smoking, contain the proliferation of tobacco use and minimise the impact of passive smoking on the public.
